

Create the length of tube that you desire，then finish it with a circle of 12 rocailles．The blue rocailles will have forget－me－nots attached to them and in between there will be $2 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{A}$ just like in the first row of the project（Fig．12）．


Firm up the end by sewing around through the beads a little，knot and cut off the excess thread．Thread the round leather or nylon cord through your flowered tube．
Using pliers add the end caps to the cords， and then add a jump ring to one end and a obster clasp to the other．You can decorate the ends by adding more forget－me－nots （Fig．13）．

## Materials and tools:

PRECIOSA Forget-Me-Not (P) 11101 362; 5 mm;

PRECIOSA Rocaille ( $\mathbf{R 1 0 - B}$ ) 33119 001; 10/0; 01131 blue; approx 2 g
nylon or leather cord for stringing, 50 cm end caps for leather cord, 2 pcs; jump rings; clasp (eg. lobster claw), clasp; necklace extender; Nymo thread or string; needle; scissors


Difficulty: $8: 8888$

The basis for creating a forget-me-not decorative tube is the net stitch. If you have the feeling that you cannot adequately tighten the end of the tube, you can first create it from rocaille using the net stitch and then decorate it with (sew-on) the forget-me-not beads.

## Procedure:

STEP 1
Pick up $12 \times \mathbf{R} 10$ alternating $1 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ with $2 \times$ R $10-\mathrm{A}$ until you have added 12 seed beads. Tie the thread and pass your needle through R10-B (Fig.1).


STEP 2
Add $2 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{A}, 1 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ a $2 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{A}$ and pass your needle through $\mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ in the direction of the stitching (Fig. 2).


## STEP 3

Then add $1 \times \mathbf{P}$ (forget-me-not bead), $1 \times$ R10-A and return through only the flower bead. Tighten the flower firmly all the way into the end of the tube, thread through $\mathbf{R 1 0 - B}$ from the first row in the direction of the stitching (Fig. 3).


STEP 4
Add another $2 \times$ R10-A, $1 \times$ R10-B and
$2 \times \mathbf{R 1 0 - A}$ and again thread through $\mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ in the direction of the stitching (Fig. 4).
Then add $1 \times \mathbf{P}, 1 \times \mathbf{R 1 0 - B}$ and return through $\mathbf{P}$


Tighten the flower firmly all the way to the end of the tube, pass through $\mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ from the first row in the direction of stitching (Fig. 5).
Repeat this process (Fig. 4 and Fig. 5) until you have added 4 pcs of $\mathbf{P}$ around the initial circle.


## STEP 5

Now you need to work with the next row. After adding the last $\mathbf{P}$ thread through

## $2 \times \mathbf{R 1 0 - A}$ and $1 \times \mathbf{R 1 0 - B}$ (Fig. 6),

The colors of the seed beads alternates within each flower ( $1 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{B}$ and $2 \times \mathbf{R} 10-\mathrm{A}$ ), which creates the illusion of a spiral. If this is too confusing, you can use one color per flower instead. The advantage of using two colors is you can better see the path of the thread (Fig. 10).


If the hollow tube doesn't hold well at the beginning, you can use knitting needles to give your hands a solid base (Fig. 11).
